DID YOU KNOW? ATTORNEY MARK MEUSER'S FACEBOOK POST

You know what is better than winning a case against the most tyrannical governor on the issue of religious liberties? Winning two cases before the Supreme Court in two business days on the issue of religious liberties.

On Friday, I was one of the attorneys on the pleadings in the case of South Bay v. Newsom where the Court entered an injunction stopping the governor from enforcing a complete ban on in-person church services.

Today, I was one of the attorneys on the pleadings in the case of Gish v. Newsom in which the Supreme Court ruled that the District Court judge and the Ninth Circuit both got it wrong when they denied our request for an injunction. Back in April, we had applied for an injunction that Gavin Newsom, the County of San Bernardino and Riverside could not ban churches from meeting. The District Court judge denied our injunction. Today the Supreme Court told the District judge he got it all wrong.

I wonder how different COVID would have been in California and in the United States if that District Court judge back in April had told Gavin he was violating the Constitution.

Hey Gavin, you may have won back in April, but I won in front of the Supreme Court in February.

I want to thank the Center for American Liberties for their funding the case of Gish v. Newsom. Their generous support enabled the attorneys to fight all the way to the Supreme Court to fight for and preserve your constitutional rights.

"And the verdict is... Hallelujah. It's over!"

The acquittal of former President Donald J. Trump is a fitting outcome to a case that should not have happened. Never before has a former president been impeached and put on trial, and it should never happen again.

In the long history of our republic, there have been only four presidential impeachments and two of them came courtesy of Pelosi and Schumer in the last two years. That's making history in all the wrong ways.

They have normalized impeachment as a partisan weapon, which is the last thing our country needs. The growing instances of violence are being stoked by extremist demands for political purity. The efforts to convict Trump and boot him from the ballot last year and in 2024 are dangerous provocations.

The final vote of 57-43 fell 10 votes short of the two-thirds needed for conviction, and was only a vote or two closer than was predicted before the circus began. The mutual decision to backtrack on the call for witnesses earlier in the day was a merciful sign that it was all over but the voting.

For Trump, the acquittal allows him to begin moving on with his life and focus on what role he wants to play in the 2022 midterms and whether he wants to run in 2024.

Expect Democrats to be especially creative in trying to keep Trump's name in the headlines. Nothing unites their fractured party like hating him and Saturday's failure will provide fuel for their perpetual outrage.

IN LOVING MEMORY PETER ERIC JAHN

November 23, 1935 – January 30, 2021

For the past several years we have been greeted by a tall self-assured man as we attended the monthly Republican Women's lunch. Upon investigation we find it is Peter Jahn, the president and ardent supporter of Brenda Jahn's fan club for over 60 years. When I met Brenda it was soon after I became friends with Peter. It was because he was always interested in her causes and activities. His standard answer was always positive as he said, "I'm breathing and standing tall."

We were all saddened to find out that Peter had given in to the 13 year battle of extensive health issues. Brenda was his nurse until the end. The following summary of his life was written by Ann Marie who expresses the love we all feel for our wonderful friend.



Peter Eric Jahn passed away at age 85 at home in Whittier, California on January 30, 2021, after a lengthy illness.

Peter is survived by his wife Brenda, by his daughter Ann Marie and her husband Simon, by his son Paul and his wife Valerie, and by his three grandchildren, Arthur, Emma, and Hayden.

Peter and his wife Brenda grew up in Bayside, New York, and moved to Whittier in 1972. They were happily married and devoted to each other for 60 years.

Peter graduated from Lehigh University in 1958 with a bachelor's degree in civil engineering. He earned an M.S. degree in civil engineering in 1967 from the Polytechnic Institute of Brooklyn (now part of New York University), studying at night.

Peter's nearly half-decade career in civil and structural engineering took him across the United States and to many countries around the world. He launched his career in engineering with the famous Ammann & Whitney company in the early 1960s. With this company he participated in two major bridge construction projects, both in New York City, the Throgs Neck Bridge and the Verrazano-Narrows Bridge. The latter was the world's longest suspension span bridge when it opened in 1964. As a young engineer he had the dangerous responsibility of checking on construction, including the spinning of cable and inspections late at night in icy winter conditions to ensure the concrete anchorages were setting correctly.

Peter took on adventurous engineering work in the 1960s. He traveled to Rwanda to help the country install its first water treatment plant as part of the USAID Mission to Rwanda, just after it became an independent country. In Saudi Arabia, he supported construction of a major telecommunications building.

After joining the Ralph M. Parsons Engineering Corporation in 1965, Peter's career in mining and ore processing took him across the United States and across the world to Australia, Canada, Mexico, and Iran. He worked in the design, procurement, and construction of major mining projects as project manager and program director.

Late in his career Peter provided expertise on major chemical demilitarization projects on Johnston Atoll in the Pacific. Chemical munitions that had been stored in the United States, China, and Germany were demilitarized at this plant. Peter also coordinated with a parallel Russian demilitarization project that was ongoing at the same time.

Peter served as chair of the Society for Mining, Metallurgy & Exploration (SME) Southern California section starting in the late 1970s and again in 2011. For many years, he was the section's representative on the Los Angeles Council of Engineers and Scientists. He was recognized by SME in January, 2012 as the Local Section Hero.

He provided many opportunities for students and young engineers to further their careers, especially during challenging economic times in the industry. His membership in the Southern California section and SME spanned nearly half a century. Peter mentored young people throughout his career. Through Peter and Brenda's dedicated work with Toastmasters over 30 years they helped many to advance in their professional lives.

Peter's love of adventure extended to his sailing trips around the world. He captained sailing vessels in Tonga, Belize, Mexico, Greece, Croatia, and the Caribbean and voyaged the oceans together with Brenda and his children, and with his close sailing friends.





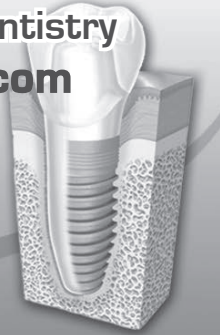
