AMERICANISM Celebrating the heritage of our US National Parks

Yellowstone National Park, the world's first national park, turned 150 years old last month. The Yellowstone National Park Protection Act signed by President Ulysses S. Grant on March 1, 1872 established Yellowstone "as a public park or pleasuring-ground for the benefit and enjoyment of the people," and placed it under exclusive control of the Secretary of the Interior.

The US National Park Service (NPS) was created by the Organic Act signed by President Woodrow Wilson on August 25, 1916, whose purpose was to "conserve the scenery and the natural and historic objects and the wild life therein and to provide for the enjoyment of the same in such manner and by such means as will leave them unimpaired for the enjoyment of future generations." The Act established a new federal bureau in the Department of the Interior responsible for protecting the 35 national parks and monuments that were managed by the department then, and those to be established in the future.

In the years following the establishment of Yellowstone, Congress authorized additional national parks and monuments administered by the Department of the Interior, many located on federal lands in the West. Through an Executive Order in 1933, 56 national monuments and military sites were transferred from the Forest Service and the War Department. This was a major development in the history of the NPS to include areas of historical as well as scenic significance that justify special recognition and protection.

The National Parks Service now comprises 401 parks covering 84 million acres in 50 states, the District of Columbia, American Samoa, Guam, Puerto Rico, Saipan, and the Virgin Islands. More than 20,000 National Park Service employees are dedicated to caring for the parks and helping to preserve their history, as well as creating recreational opportunities for all to enjoy. About 60 percent of the parks include important US historical sites like battlefields, memorials, and historical homes, as well as dwellings, petroglyphs, and pictographs from earlier cultures.

Additions to the National Park System are generally made through acts of Congress, and national parks can be created only through such acts. The President of the United States also has authority to proclaim national monuments on lands already under federal jurisdiction.

The National Park System saw more than 297 million visits last year, which was 60 million more than in 2020 when most parks were closed due to COVID-19, but lower than pre-pandemic totals. The highest number of park visits was more than 330 million visits in 2016.

With 15.9 million visits, the most visited national park last year was Blue Ridge Parkway, which connects Shenandoah National Park in Virginia to Great Smoky Mountains National Park in North Carolina, which saw the second highest number of visits. Golden Gate National Recreation Area in Oakland, California had the third highest number of visits last year.

MADELEINE ALBRIGHT, FIRST WOMAN SECRETARY OF STATE, PASSES AWAY AT 84

***"Take it from someone who fled the Iron Curtain:
I know what happens when you give the Russians a green light."

Madeleine Albright, who made history as the first woman to be appointed Secretary of State, died of cancer on March 23 at the age of 84. She served as the 64th U.S. Secretary of State under President Bill Clinton from 1997-2001.

Albright was born Marie Jean "Madlenka" Korbel on May 15, 1937, in Prague, Czechoslovakia. Her family fled to London in 1939 when the Nazis occupied her homeland. The family returned after the war but sought political asylum in Colorado nine years later to escape the Communist regime.

Albright became a U.S. citizen at the age of 20, speaking Czech, French, Serbo-Croat and English. Two years later, she graduated from Wellesley College and ultimately received her master's degree and Ph.D. in public law and government from Columbia University.

Albright began her career in government and public affairs by working on Senator Edmund Muskie's unsuccessful 1972 presidential campaign. She later served as his chief legislative assistant from 1976 to 1978. From 1978 to 1981, Albright worked as a staff member in the White House under President Jimmy Carter and on the National Security Council under National Security Adviser Zbigniew Brzezinski. She was also a foreign policy adviser for Senator Walter F. Mondale, Governor Michael Dukakis, and President Clinton.

In 1993, President Clinton appointed Albright Ambassador to the United Nations, where she served until her Secretary of State position. President Barack Obama awarded Albright the Presidential Medal of Freedom, the country's highest civilian honor, in 2012.

Albright had a strong influence on American diplomacy, and her personal experience as a child refugee prompted her approach to post-Cold War Europe. She was devoted to advancing peace in the Middle East and advocated for human rights across the globe. As Secretary of State, she promoted the expansion of NATO eastward into the former Soviet bloc nations and the non-proliferation of nuclear weapons from the former Soviet republics to rogue nations, successfully pressed for military intervention under NATO during the humanitarian crisis in Kosovo in 1999, favored the ratification of the Kyoto Protocol on Global Climate Change, and furthered the normalization of relations with Vietnam.

In 2000, soon after Vladimir Putin became Russian president, Albright was the first senior US official to meet him. She later called him "smart, but a very bad person."

Even up until the end of her life, Albright was sounding the alarm about Putin. "Ukraine is entitled to its sovereignty, no matter who its neighbors happen to be," wrote Albright in an essay in *The New York Times* in February. "In the modern era, great countries accept that, and so must Mr. Putin. That is the message undergirding recent Western diplomacy. It defines the difference between a world governed by the rule of law and one answerable to no rules at all."

DO YOU REMEMBER?

May 1, 1960 - An American U-2 spy plane flying at 60,000 feet was shot down over Sverdlovsk in central Russia on the eve of a summit meeting between President Dwight D. Eisenhower and Soviet Russia's Premier Nikita Khrushchev. The sensational incident caused a cancellation of the meeting and heightened existing Cold War tensions. The pilot, CIA agent Francis Gary Powers, survived the crash, and was tried, convicted and sentenced to 10 years in prison by a Russian court. Two years later he was released to America in exchange for an imprisoned soviet spy. On his return to America, Powers encountered a hostile public which apparently believed he should not have allowed himself to be captured alive. He died in a helicopter crash in 1977.

May 22, 1972 - President Richard Nixon became the first American president to visit Moscow. Four days later, Nixon and Soviet Russia's leader Leonid Brezhnev signed a pact

pledging to freeze nuclear arsenals at current levels.

May 2, 2011 - U.S. Special Operations Forces killed Osama bin Laden during a raid on his secret compound in Abbottabad, Pakistan. The raid marked the culmination of a decade long manhunt for the elusive leader of the al-Qaeda terrorist organization based in the Middle East. Bin Laden had ordered the coordinated aerial attacks of September 11th, 2001, in which four American passenger jets were hijacked then crashed, killing nearly 3,000 persons. Two jets had struck and subsequently collapsed the 110 story Twin Towers of the World Trade Center in New York, while another struck the Pentagon building in Washington, D.C. A fourth jet also headed toward Washington had crashed into a field in Pennsylvania as passengers attempted to overpower the hijackers on board.

CANDIDATE ENDORSEMENT CHEAT SHEET

- ONE Republican candidate running in an election?
- Your CFRW club can endorse.
- MORE than one Republican candidate running in an election?

You need to thoroughly study the CFRW Bylaws, Article V-ETHICS, and the CFRW Policy Section I. Endorsement Policy

SPECIAL RULES APPLY TO ALL CLUB PRESIDENTS AND CLUB CAMPAIGN CHAIRS as well as CFRW PRESIDENT, CFRW VICE-PRESIDENTS AND CFRW REGIONAL DIRECTORS

CFRW's President, Vice Presidents, Regional Directors, Local Club Presidents, and Campaign Activities Chair shall not publicly endorse any candidate for public office in any primary, runoff, special or non-partisan race where two or more known Republicans are in the race.

Examples of endorsing are public displays of support including:

- block walking,
- phone banking,
- handing out cards,
- sending emails,
- placing signs in yards,
- donating funds,
- attending fundraisers, and
- social media posts

PLEASE NOTE: No endorsement or evidence of support by any member shall be issued using the NFRW, CFRW, or local club affiliation, logo, or stationery. CFRW Bylaws, Article V-ETHICS and CFRW Policy Section I. Endorsement Policy.



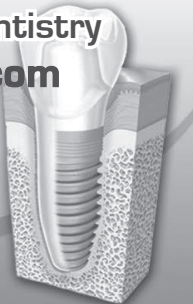
